

Alexander Kohler is an expert in higher education governance and quality assurance. He is currently working with the Austrian Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research with specific focus on the funding of public universities through performance agreements, on teaching quality and on the implementation of the reform of teacher education in Austria.

Alexander also works as an independent consultant in international projects dealing with higher education policies, institutional quality management and accreditation (esp. South-Eastern Europe and Africa).

In 2004, he built up and managed the Austrian Agency for Quality Assurance who advised and audited higher education institutions in Austria and other European countries. In this function he was member of various international expert groups and quality assurance networks.

Between 1999 and 2004, he directed the Austrian national agency for the EU funding programme "Leonardo da Vinci".

Alexander's international experience also includes his employment as a seconded national expert at the European Commission in Brussels and the European Centre for the Development of Vocational Training (Cedefop) in Thessaloniki (1996 to 1999). His main areas of works and research included the funding of education and human resources development.

He holds a degree in economics and business administration from the Vienna University of Economics and Business, where also worked as a young researcher.
