



Fabrice Henard is an international strategy consultant specialising in educational and skills policies as well as quality assurance. He has been working for more than 18 years in the field of evaluation of public policies, especially for European and international projects dealing with quality assurance, internationalisation, governance and quality of teaching and learning in higher education. His geographic areas encompass Europe, Asia, Africa and Maghreb. Fabrice has been the Secretary General to the Accreditation Committee of Luxembourg since 2013.

He is a member of the US Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) International Group and a Reviewer for the Journal Quality. Recent projects as team leader includes: assistance to operationalization of the Moroccan QA Agency (EU-funded assistance), Higher Education Employability project in Tunisia (World Bank), Setting the Asian Higher Education Area in SouthEast Asia (EU-SHARE project until 2019), review of the Albanian QA system and Montenegrin QA system (World Bank).

Fabrice is regularly commissioned for his expertise on quality assurance and on educational policies by the Quality assurance agencies (Belgium, Armenia), the United Nations (UNICEF, UNESCO, UNFPA), the World Bank, the European Commission and the Association of French-speaking universities and NGOs. In 2016, the EU Directorate General for Education and Culture selected him as the national expert for France on educational policy, intended to support the DGEAC in the analysis of Member States' policy developments from early childhood to higher education. Fabrice's recent publications include the CHEA International Quality Principles (2016), on quality and society and guidelines on quality teaching and internationalisation (OECD). Fabrice was an Analyst at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development at the OECD programme on higher education (2007-2013), an Evaluator at the French Quality Assurance Agency (2003-2007) involved of European projects on quality (ENQA), and senior consultant at the Center for European Evaluation and Expertise (1999- 2003). A French native, Fabrice is a graduate from Sciences Po-University Paris (1991) and holds a Master in Urban Policy from Sciences Po-University Paris (1993).
